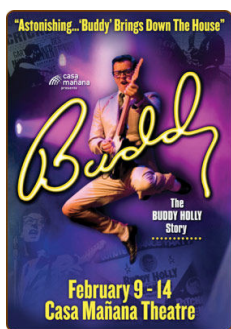
NOTE: The new parking garage for DeSoto Civic Center can be accessed by entering the courtyard from Pleasant Run as well as from Hampton.

Hummer House – A West Texas Oasis

May 19, 20, 21, 2010



Eighteen miles south of San Angelo, along the banks of the South Concho River, the Hummer House is the summer home to Texas' largest concentration of breeding and nesting Black-chinned Hummingbirds, joined with numerous other bird species native to the area. A private lecture and bird banding demonstration, followed by a catered luncheon will highlight this tour. Some of the planned activities include: M. L. Leddy's & Sons bootmaking tour, Ingrid's Custom Hand Woven Rugs demo, a visit to a monastery in Christoval, Miss Hattie's tour of the Best Little Bordello Museum in Texas, a tour of Fort Concho (built in 1867 to protect settlers from Indian attacks), a visit to Paint Rock which is named for extensive Indian pictographs found there, and a meal at the famous Lowake Steak House...with it's own landing strip for clients. Niagara Falls, Buffalo and Toronto

See the American and Bridal Veil Falls and Canadian "Horseshoe" Falls, where almost 1/3 of the Canadian Falls lies within US Territory. Five night stay near Niagara Falls on the Canadian side.
